- ¹⁴ in many-colored robes she is led to the king, with her virgin companions, her escort, in her train.
- ¹⁵ With joy and gladness they are led along as they enter the palace of the king.
- ¹⁶ Instead of your fathers shall be your sons; you will make them princes in all the earth.
- ¹⁷ I will cause your name to be celebrated in all generations; therefore the peoples will praise you for ever and ever.

5. In Gen 24:65, Rebekah "took her veil and covered herself." What is the value of a veil? When is a woman properly "unveiled"? How does a Patriarch honor modesty? How does a Patriarch inculcate modesty in his offspring?

6. This is the last story of Abraham's life. Why is that significant? For what purpose are all of a Patriarch's "blessings"?
