
Notes:

DEUTERONOMY 32 THE SONG OF MOSES

- ³⁵ Vengeance is mine, and recompense, for the time when their foot shall slip; for the day of their calamity is at hand, and their doom comes swiftly.
- ³⁶ For the LORD will vindicate his people and have compassion on his servants, when he sees that their power is gone, and there is none remaining, bond or free.

MOSES PREPARES ISRAEL FOR BATTLE NUMBERS & DEUTERONOMY EXCERPTS

Unifying the Sons of Israel Numbers 32:1-32

- 1. What is the strategic purpose the tribes of Reuben and Gad seek in stopping short of the Promised Land? When have you departed ways with loved ones for a strategic purpose? Did your loved ones understand or support you? How can a Patriarch support his children before & after they depart for a strategic purpose?
- 2. What is Moses' appeal to the tribes of Reuben & Gad to convince them to fight for their brethren? What are some experiences you've had of "fighting for a sibling" or vice versa? What are some ways your children fight for each other? How is Moses' appeal a model for you in encouraging your children to fight for each other?

The Lord's Battle Plan Numbers 33:50-56

- 3. Why are the Israelite's commanded to drive out all of the inhabitants of the Land? How are Christ's words in Matthew 18:8-9 the ultimate fulfillment of this concept? What literal actions can you employ and teach to your children in regards to driving negative influences out of their life?
- 4. The Lord commands that large families who need more will receive more. What are the different needs within your own family? Which children need more from you right now and which children need less? How do you balance giving more to certain children without leaving the rest feeling jealous?

- 5. Joshua becomes Moses' successor publicly in the sight of all Israel. How will this public succession be a blessing to Joshua in the future? How can you arrange your children to succeed you in a way that will provide a blessing to them long into the future?
- 6. Before Moses relinquishes his final authority to Joshua, he recounts great works of the Lord. Why does Moses do this? Are your children aware of the great works of the Lord in scripture? Before your children depart on their own, what great works of the Lord in your own life should they be aware of?
