THE HARDENED HEART OF PHARAOH Exodus 7:7 - 8:19

- 1. Now Moses was eighty years old, and Aaron eighty-three... In what previous Biblical stories does the younger son outrank the older son? How does a Patriarch respectfully lead men who are older? How does a Patriarch graciously follow men who are younger?
- 2. In the first three signs (Serpent, Blood, Frogs), Pharaoh's wise men are able to duplicate the signs of Moses and Aaron. In what ways have modern ideologies and sects imitated God's authority? How does a Patriarch discern between authentic and inauthentic "messages," "signs," and "wonders"?
- 3. At the end of each plague, Pharaoh's heart is "hardened." What causes a man's heart to harden? What advantages do men find in 'hardening' their hearts? What are the disadvantages? How does a Patriarch exercise dominion over his heart? What are some ways a Patriarch 'un-hardens' his heart?
- 4. In Exodus 8:8, "Pharaoh called Moses and Aaron, and said, 'Entreat the Lord to take away the frogs...and I will let the people go to sacrifice to the Lord." What is Pharaoh acknowledging about the God of the Hebrews here? What is Pharaoh's conditional bargain? Why do Patriarchs 'bargain' with God?
- 5. After the crisis of frogs disappears, Pharaoh reneges on his bargain with God. What is it about adversity that presses a Patriarch toward God? What is it about prosperity that permits distance between a Patriarch and God?
- 6. How is God fathering Moses through this series of plagues? What is Moses learning? What is Israel learning? How is God fathering Pharaoh through these series of plagues? What will Pharaoh learn? Through what "series of experiences" has God fathered you? Coaches and teachers put men through "series of experiences" for education and training what "series of experiences" have you established for your children's formation?
