- 11. I will teach one of my children how to grow in personal prayer (perhaps in Petition, Intercession, Blessing, Thanksgiving, Praise).



How does communication with God help you see a "bigger picture"? How are you training your offspring to communicate with God? How do you help your offspring to "raise their eyes" and see a "bigger picture"?
